



\$5000 reward offered for info, conviction in gay man's death

(AP) A national gay rights group is offering a reward for information leading to a conviction in the death of a 72-year-old gay man in Detroit.

The death of Andrew Anthos had been widely reported as an anti-gay hate crime after he said he was clubbed on the head by a man using sexual slurs.

But this week, Detroit police said that Anthos actually died of natural causes after an arthritic spine caused leg paralysis and a fall. Police also say they didn't find witnesses to an attack on Anthos on February 13th.

Gay rights advocates say they still believe Anthos was attacked, and the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force is offering a \$5000 reward for tips in the case.
